

Pee Wee League Basketball Guidelines: Grades 3-5 Below are the standards and rules in which this league will operate. Many of these rules are based on USA Basketball recommendations. These shall serve as guidelines for those coaching, officiating, and administering. Some rules may be modified during the season if the league administrator sees it is in the best interest of the participants.



Equipment and Court Specifications

Size of Ball	28.5"
Height of Basket	10'
Court	Full Court
Distance of Free Throw Line	14'

Game Structure

Game Length	Four 8-minute periods
Substitutions	Every 4 minutes, in a dead-ball situation (this is not a timeout)
Time Between Periods	1 minute
Extra Period	2 minutes
Scoring	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Free throw: 1 point, all field goals: 2 points, no 3-point field goals at this level Shooting fouls shall result in 1 automatic point, preceded by 1 foul shot Common fouls shall result in 1 automatic point until the final 4-minute substitution point (does not include player control fouls)
Timeouts	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Two 60-second timeouts permitted per half of play One 60-second timeout permitted in the extra period Unused timeouts do not carry over to the next half or extra period
Start of Game Possession	Coin flip. Team awarded possession starts with throw-in at half court

Game Tactics

Playing Time	Equal playing time
Set Defense	Only player-to-player defense throughout the competition
Pressing Defense	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Full court pressing defense is not allowed until the final 2 minutes of the regulation, or extra period, but must remain player-to-player Leading team may not extend defense beyond half court
Double-Team/Crowding	Double-team/crowding is not allowed throughout game
Stealing from the Dribbler	Coaches discretion throughout the game

Highlighted Game Play Rules

Backcourt Timeline	10 seconds
Shot Clock	N/A
5 Seconds Closely Guarded	Only when offensive player is holding the basketball
Clock Stoppage	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Running clock until the final minute of each half and extra period Substitutions Timeouts
Length of Time for a Free-Throw	10 seconds
Advancement of Ball after a Timeout	N/A
Unsportsmanlike or Technical Foul	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Players will automatically be ejected from game Coaches who receive 2 in a game, must exit the facility

Rationale

- Elimination of the 3-point field goal:
 - Encourages players to shoot from within a developmentally-appropriate range and develop proper mechanics/form.
- Distance of free throw line:
 - The 14-foot free throw distance helps develop proper form and increase success.
- Size of ball:
 - Usage of a smaller basketball is due to the size of a child's hand as well as their developing skill level.
 - A smaller ball allows for better control and success.
- Start of the game possession:
 - The coin flip to start the game will mitigate the differences in height and coordination among players.
 - Alternating possessions will take place throughout the rest of the game.
- Substitution rules:
 - This helps ensure all participants are having an opportunity to experience the game with equal and fair playing time.
- Set defense:
 - The requirement of player-to-player defense encourages physical activity/movement, while promoting skill development related to guarding a player both on and off the ball.
- Clock stoppage:
 - The balance of clock stoppage allows for better game flow, and proper substitution of players.
- Points for fouls:
 - This discourages fouling due to automatic points and retaining possession.
 - Decreases idle time standing and watching free throws.
 - Increases game flow.
 - Players cannot foul out and be eliminated from play.

Sportsmanship

- Spectators that show poor sportsmanship including, booing, harassing officials, arguing calls, negative behavior or comments, or threats or obscene gestures shall be given 1 warning, and then ejected from the facility. Play will not resume until spectator has exited. If they refuse to leave, the game will end, and the individual will be issued a suspension notice which will apply to all Harrisonburg Parks and Recreation facilities and parks.
- Cheering in a positive manner for both teams is highly encouraged. Remember, it takes a lot of nerve for our players to get in front of a crowd and PLAY. Please remember this during the game and help us build the positive experiences through the game of basketball.
- Please refrain from coaching our players from the bleachers during games. We have coaches who volunteer their time to do this, let them coach! This is also very distracting to our players. Again, don't be the reason for increased anxiety to our players.

Registration

Practices

- Teams will have 1-3 scheduled practices prior to the season starting.
- Practices will last no more than 1 hour.
- Practices will be held at the Community Activities Center at 305 S. Dogwood Dr., Harrisonburg, VA 22801.
- Teams will have various scheduled practice times throughout the season.

Game Day

- Please arrive 20 minutes prior to the start of the game.
- Jerseys will be provided for each team. Please return these following each game.
- Teams will be allowed a minimum of 15 minutes to warm-up prior to their game.
- Games will be scheduled for 6:30pm and 7:30pm. If the 6:30pm game ends late, we will start 15 minutes following the end of the 6:30pm game.
- Officials are contracted through the JMU Student Officials Association and will utilize VHSL basketball rules with a few modifications listed in these guidelines. Please be respectful of all official calls.
- No food or beverages other than water will not be permitted in our gymnasium.
- Parents/guardians are responsible for the supervision of their children that accompany them to the games.

Team Selection

- Teams will be organized and divided by grade and school.
- Volunteer coaches, who have children in the program, will be automatically assigned their own children.
- Siblings will be placed together on the same team.
- Teams may not be requested, this is to help prevent an imbalance of talent.
