Article 3:

U8 Basketball League Guidelines: Below are the standards and rules in which this league will operate. All these rules are based on USA Basketball recommendations with some modifications. These shall serve as guidelines for those playing, coaching, officiating, and administering. Some rules may be modified during the season if the league administrator sees it is in the best interest of the participants.

Equipment and Court Specifications

Size of Ball	27.5"
Height of Basket	8 feet
Court	Cross Court
Distance of Free Throw Line	12' or 14'

Game Structure

Game Length	Four 8-minute periods	
Substitutions	Every 4 minutes	
Time Between Periods	1 minute with a 3-minute halftime	
Extra Period	N/A	
Scoring	 No score will be kept Free throw: player will shoot 1 shot only on shooting fouls called. All other players must be behind half court and regardless of a miss or a make possession changes, and the team will inbound the ball under the free throw shooters basket 	
Timeouts	 One 60-second timeout permitted per half of play One 60-second timeout permitted in the extra period Unused timeouts do not carry over to the next half or extra period 	
Start of Game Possession	Coin toss, throw in from halfcourt	
Fouls	Fouls will be called in a teaching manner, explanation given to players of what they are doing wrong, if it is a shooting foul the shooter will be awarded 1 free throw.	

Game Tactics

Playing Time	Equal playing time (substitutions on 4-minute mark of each quarter)
Set Defense	Only player-to-player defense throughout the game
Pressing Defense	Only allowed in the last 2 minutes of the 4 th quarter
Double-Team/Crowding	Double-team/crowding is not allowed at any point in the game
Stealing from the Dribbler	Defense must be behind halfcourt, after the dribbler crosses halfcourt and are picked up by their defender the ball may be stolen if possible

Article 4: Rationale

- Elimination of the 3-point field goal:
 - Encourages players to shoot from within a developmentally appropriate range and develop proper mechanics/form.
- Distance of free throw line:
 - The 12-foot or 14-foot free throw distance helps develop proper form and increase success.
- Size of ball:
 - Usage of a smaller basketball is due to the size of a child's hand as well as their developing skill level.
 - A smaller ball allows for better control and success.
- Start of the game possession:
 - The coin flip to start the game will mitigate the differences in height and coordination among players.
 - Alternating possessions will take place throughout the rest of the game.
- Substitution rules:
 - This helps ensure all participants are having an opportunity to experience the game with equal and fair playing time.
- Set defense:
 - The requirement of player-to-player defense encourages physical activity/movement, while promoting skill development related to guarding a player both on and off the ball.
- 5 Seconds Closely Guarded:
 - This is the introduction to this rule. This help coaches to teach quick decision making and stops players from just standing still with the ball not making a basketball move.
- Clock stoppage:
 - o The balance of clock stoppage allows for better game flow, and proper substitution of players.

Article 5: Sportsmanship Policy

- Spectators that show poor sportsmanship including, booing, harassing coaches/administrators, arguing
 calls, negative behavior or comments, or threats or obscene gestures shall be given 1 warning, and
 then ejected from the facility. Play will not resume until spectator has exited. If they refuse to leave,
 the game will end, and the individual will be issued a suspension notice which will apply to all
 Harrisonburg Parks and Recreation facilities and parks.
- Cheering in a positive manner for both teams is highly encouraged. Remember, it takes a lot of nerve for our players to get in front of a crowd and PLAY. Please remember this during the game and help us build the positive experiences through the game of basketball.
- Please refrain from coaching our players from the bleachers during games. We have coaches who
 volunteer their time to do this, let them coach! This is also very distracting to our players. Again, don't
 be the reason for increased anxiety to our players.

Article 7: Practices

- Teams will have practices prior to the first game.
- Practices will last no more than 45 minutes.
- Practices will be held at the Community Activities Center at 305 S. Dogwood Drive, Harrisonburg, VA 22801.
- Teams will have various scheduled practice times throughout the season.

Article 8: Game Day

- Please arrive 10 minutes prior to the start of the game.
- Uniforms will be provided for each team.
- Only water will be permitted in our gymnasium.
- Parents/guardians are responsible for the supervision of their children that accompany them to the games.

 - All Parks and Recreation programs, classes and events will be cancelled at the same announced time of City of Harrisonburg Public School closing.
 - o In the event of inclement weather when City of Harrisonburg Public Schools are not in session or a non-school day:
 - The Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to cancel programs and close facilities should weather conditions warrant. Notifications of cancellations and closings will be made through the above listed Facebook and Twitter page.

Article 10: Team Selection

- Teams will be organized and divided by age and school (if possible).
- Volunteer coaches, who have children in the program, will be automatically assigned their own children.
- Siblings will be placed together on the same team, if they are in the same age group.
- Participants and parents may not request to be placed on a specific team.
