## Golf Course Accepts Proposals for Food and Beverage Vendor

Harrisonburg, Va. – The city’s Department of Parks and Recreation is seeking proposals for the food and beverage operator at Heritage Oaks Golf Course.

The restaurant offers a full kitchen and dining area to serve golfers, tournaments, special events, and the general public. Inside, there is seating capacity of 42 with an additional 20 seats on the outdoor patio, which has beautiful mountain views and overlooks the practice putting green.

“This would be a great opportunity for a start-up or small restaurant business or a caterer looking to expand,” explained David Wigginton, assistant director of Parks and Recreation. “The setting would also be ideal for an already established restaurant looking to branch out and offer a second location.”

Heritage Oaks Golf Course, a public course, was voted “Best of the Valley” in 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, and 2015 and is a challenging and scenic course for golfers of all abilities. This is also the home course for area high school golf teams. It is conveniently located near residential neighborhoods for easy pick up or delivery if a business so desires.

All proposals must be received no later than Thursday, March 17 at 3:00 p.m. Proposals should be submitted to the city’s Finance Department’s Purchasing Office in City Hall on the third floor, 409 S.
