## City Closures for the Independence Day Holiday

Harrisonburg, Va. – Governmental offices in the city of Harrisonburg will be closed on Wednesday, July 4 for the Independence Day holiday.

### Refuse Collection

Refuse that is collected on Wednesday, July 4 will need to be held until Thursday, July 5.

Bulk and yard debris will not be collected on July 4 but will be collected on the next regularly scheduled date of July 18; however, residents are invited to take their bulk and yard debris to the Recycling Convenience Center during their normal business hours.

The Recycling Convenience Center will be closed on July 4.

### Transportation Service

There will be no transit service by the Harrisonburg Department of Public Transportation on Wednesday, July 4.

### Parks and Recreation

Westover Park will be the launch site for the Valley Fourth fireworks display and the park must be vacated. The upper portion of Westover Park (disc golf course, playground, shelters, and the Senior Center) will be closed to vehicles and pedestrians, starting at 1:00 p.m. The lower portion of Westover Park (Westover Pool) will be closed starting at 5:00 p.m. A rain date of July 5 has been scheduled for all Valley Fourth festivities.

Westover Park will reopen to the public at 8:00 a.m. on July 5, unless the rain date is needed.
