HPD Encourages Back to School Safety

Harrisonburg, Va. As summer draws to a close and students of all ages return to school, the Harrisonburg Police Department reminds drivers and pedestrians the importance of safety in school zones and throughout the city in general. Starting Tuesday, August 19, HPD will be patrolling and strictly enforcing driving infractions in all school zones and roadways near schools where students both walk and bike.

With school in session, there will be significantly more traffic - buses, pedestrians, and parents transporting students, all of which contribute to school zone congestion.

"Traffic issues such as speeding, parking, u-turns, and distractions are very prevalent in these zones, and drivers are urged to slow down, be alert, and practice safe driving skills," stated HPD Traffic Supervisor Pete Ritchie, Jr.

HPD recommends these simple suggestions to help make school zones safer for everyone:

- Don't Speed
- Don't impede traffic
- Don't block intersections or school entrances
- Watch for children on foot and on bicycles
- Ensure seatbelt use when transporting students to and from school
- Don't use cell phones, and absolutely No texting

Special attention must also be paid to buses displaying flashing red lights when on an undivided roadway. In these instances, drivers are required by state law to stop and wait until the flashing red lights are turned off before passing a bus.
