## **Arrest Made in Storage Unit Burglaries**

The Harrisonburg Police Department received numerous reports of burglaries that had occurred at a mini storage facility on Acorn Drive between the December 22, 2015 and December 27, 2015. Initially six units were reported to have been burglarized. The offender had apparently cut the pad locks from the doors to the units and stolen items from inside the individual storage units. More than \$10,000 in property was reported as stolen, and stolen items included electronics, hunting equipment, bicycles, and clothing. No firearms were believed to have been stolen in these incidents.

After further investigation, the Harrisonburg Police Department learned that the offender entered into at least 13 storage units altogether in four separate incidents, but not all of the renters reported stolen property from each unit. The facility's surveillance system captured the suspect and his vehicle on several recordings, and officers later identified the suspect as Tommy Duncan, 38, who recently moved to Harrisonburg from Altus, Oklahoma. After partnering with the US Marshals Service, HPD officers and US Marshals located and arrested Duncan without incident on January 7, 2016 in the City of Harrisonburg. Duncan was released on a secured bond pending trial. He was charged with two counts each of burglary, grand larceny, and grand larceny with the intent to sell stolen property.
