Not only do participants receive an in-depth knowledge of HPD, they will also get insight into how the department functions through a multitude of scenarios that apply to policing in today's society. Participants will learn through both hands-on and classroom experiences about HPD's Major Crimes Unit, Police K-9's, SWAT Operations, Drug and Gang Units, shoot department weapons in a controlled environment, and complete a ride along with a patrol officer.
