Sealed proposals, subject to terms and conditions of this Request for Proposal will be received by the City of Harrisonburg Department of Planning & Community Development, 409 S. Main Street, Harrisonburg, Virginia 22801 until the date/ time specified above for furnishing items or services delivered or furnished to specified destinations within the time specified or stipulated by the vendor(s).

The City does not discriminate against small and minority businesses or faith-based organizations.

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I. PURPOSE

The City of Harrisonburg, Virginia (City) is issuing an invitation to bid for services for exterior painting of the Harrisonburg Municipal Building, located at 345 South Main Street, Harrisonburg, Virginia. This work will include preparation of the exterior of the building and trim for painting including minor repairs as needed and the painting of the portions of the building that are currently painted. The paint color will be predetermined by the City, with the purchasing of all materials being the responsibility of the contractor and included in the bid. Hours of operation are 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM Monday through Friday.

II. BID SUBMISSION INFORMATION

A mandatory Pre-Bid meeting will be held Friday, May 17, 2013 at 10:00 am local time at 345 South Main St, Harrisonburg, VA.

Late bids will not be accepted. The City will reserve the right to waive or not waive any informality in any bid and to cancel the bid. Bids shall be in strict accordance with the scope of work and the general terms and conditions as outlined in this document and the Purchasing and Contracting Policy Manual for the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia.

III. EVALUATION & AWARD

The Invitation for sealed Bid will be awarded to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder submitting for painting services, as described in the scope of work, proposed time frame, and meeting the standards set forth by the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia. The City reserves the right to choose the painting method, either rolling or brushing, whichever is in the best interest of the City. Any costs incurred by offerors in preparing or submitting bid or proposals are the offeror's sole responsibility; the City of Harrisonburg will not reimburse any offeror for any costs incurred as a result of the preparation of this request for bid or proposal.

IV. REFERENCES – BIDDERS MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Contractor must have a minimum of five (5) years continuous experience, prior to the date of submission of their bid in the management and operation of a business engaging in providing PAINTING SERVICES, and actually engaged in providing these services to commercial or industrial accounts under contract.

Contractor must provide with their bid a list of five (5) commercial or industrial references for work of a similar nature which clearly demonstrate the firm's ability to successfully perform under this contract. Please verify the names, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses prior to submitting them as references.

V. SCOPE OF SERVICES

This Invitation to Bid is asking for contractors to provide the labor, supervision, materials, equipment, tools and incidentals to perform exterior painting as described in this document. The project will consist of preparing the building for painting, protecting all surfaces not scheduled to be painted including surrounding sidewalks and planting areas and other objects, and the painting of the exterior of the building. The contractor will be painting all painted surfaces of the Municipal Building, including exterior currently painted brick walls, columns, window and door trims, stairways, exposed roof joists and eves, exhaust flashings, ventilation grates, and railings. The existing stone work is NOT to be painted.

The City offices will remain open for regular business (8:00 am to 5:00 PM Monday-Friday) during the painting so all work must be performed in a manner to not disrupt any business traffic and to protect the safety of all pedestrians and vehicles. The contractor is solely responsible for the protection and safety of the employees of the building and the public and use appropriate means to ensure this safety at all times of work.

Proper preparation of the building to obtain a satisfactory finish will be the responsibility of the contractor. This includes but is not limited to filling holes and cracks, removal and replacement of any old caulk that is loose or cracked, scraping and sanding any peeling and/or loose paint, proper preparation and care of all wood, spot priming all bare and exposed areas and power washing the exterior of the building to achieve a clean paintable surface. Proper care must be exercised to ensure that debris from the washing does not enter the storm drain system.

In addition to the safety of the employees, customers and pedestrians, the contractor is responsible for the protection of all items and surfaces not scheduled to be painted and these areas must be kept clean throughout, and at the completion of, the process. These areas include but are not limited to window panes, walkways, glass entry doors, plant materials, light fixtures, electrical equipment, heating and cooling equipment, gas equipment and decorative water features.

Further specifications include:

- All caulk used is to be an exterior ten (10) year silicone latex caulk.
- Any loose wood is to be renailed.
- Paint is to be applied to manufacturers' specifications. Bids should be provided for rolling of brick surface as well as spraying of brick surface. Wood work and trims are to be brushed or rolled.
- All paint work shall be given at least a one year warranty on materials and labor.
- All painting related debris will be picked up and removed on a daily basis, to include but not be limited to paint cans, rags, application materials, ladders, etc.
- Paint flakes are to be removed from the exterior of the building before completion of the work.
- All windows must be capable of opening after completion of the work.
- Do not paint over dirt, rust, scale, grease, moisture, scuffed surfaces, or conditions otherwise detrimental to formation of a durable paint film.
- Paint for exterior brick is to be Sherwin Williams Duration Acrylic Latex Coating, flat, in Argos (SW 7065); paint for woodwork is to be Sherwin Williams Duration Acrylic Latex Coating, satin, in Extra White (SW 7006); paint for exterior metal stairs is to be Sherwin Williams Industrial Enamel Black (B54BZ11).

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

By signing and submitting a bid under this solicitation, the provider certifies that if awarded the contract, they will have the following insurance coverages at the time the contract is awarded. If any subcontractors are involved, the subcontractor will have workers' compensation insurance. The provider further certifies that they or any subcontractors will maintain these insurance coverages during the entire term of the contract and that all insurance coverages will be provided by insurance companies authorized to sell insurance in Virginia by the Virginia State Corporation Commission.

The City of Harrisonburg requires **by endorsement**, to be added as an additional insured on the vendor policy and a Certificate of Insurance needs to be filed with the City showing the City of Harrisonburg listed as an additional insured. We also request a copy of the actual endorsement issued by the insurance company.

INSURANCE COVERAGES AND LIMITS REQUIRED:

- 1. Worker's Compensation Statutory requirements and benefits.
- 2. Commercial General Liability \$1,000,000 combined single limit.
- 3. Automobile Liability \$1,000,000 combined single limit.

VI. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The proposal must include:

On Bid Form:

- Cost, including all materials and services. Provide costs for both rolling and brushing of paint.
- Proposed time frame for commencement, progress and completion of work.
- Description of number of staff to be devoted to the project.
- Equipment available to utilize for the project

On a separate sheet provide:

- Relevant experience and qualifications including references.
- Description of methods to be used to complete the project including methods to be used for preparation of surfaces and application of paint.

VII. PAYMENT TERMS

After 50% of work is completed the contractor may request payment after inspection and approval from City. Contractor invoice must show a 5% retention which will be withheld from the first payment. After work is completed the remainder of the contract amount may be requested with an additional 5% withheld. The 5% retainage will be paid upon final inspection and satisfaction from the City.

VIII. WORK SITE DAMAGES

Any damage resulting from work performed under this contract shall be repaired to the City's satisfaction at the contractor's expense.

ATTACHMENT B. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE CITY OF HARRISONBURG, VA

<u>PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING MANUAL</u>: This solicitation is subject to the provisions of The Purchasing and Contracting Policy Manual for the City of Harrisonburg (City) and any revisions thereto, which are hereby incorporated into this contract in their entirety. A copy of the manual is available for review at www.Harrisonburgva.gov/bids.

<u>APPLICABLE LAWS AND COURTS</u>: This solicitation and any resulting contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of the Commonwealth. The contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations.

ANTI-DISCRIMINATION: By submitting their (bids/proposals), (bidders/offerors) certify to the City that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians With Disabilities Act, the Americans With Disabilities Act and 2.2-4311 of the *Virginia Public Procurement Act*.

In every contract over \$10,000 the provisions below apply:

- 1. During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:
- a. The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin, age, disability, or any other basis prohibited by state law relating to discrimination in employment, except where there is a bona fide occupational qualification reasonably necessary to the normal operation of the contractor. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b. The contractor, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, will state that such contractor is an equal opportunity employer.
- c. Notices, advertisements and solicitations placed in accordance with federal law, rule or regulation shall be deemed sufficient for the purpose of meeting these requirements.

The contractor will include the provisions of 1. above in every subcontract or purchase order over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

2. The City does not discriminate against small and minority businesses or faith based organizations.

ETHICS IN PUBLIC CONTRACTING: By submitting their (bids/proposals), (bidders/offerors) certify that their (bids/proposals) are made without collusion or fraud and that they have not offered or received any kickbacks or inducements from any other (bidder/offeror), supplier, manufacturer or subcontractor in connection with their (bid/proposal), and that they have not conferred on any public employee having official responsibility for this procurement transaction any payment, loan, subscription, advance, deposit of money, services or anything of more than nominal value, present or promised, unless consideration of substantially equal or greater value was exchanged.

<u>IMMIGRATION REFORM AND CONTROL ACT OF 1986</u>: By submitting their (bids/proposals), (bidders/offerors) certify that they do not and will not during the performance of this contract employ illegal alien workers or otherwise violate the provisions of the federal Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986.

<u>DEBARMENT STATUS</u>: By submitting their (bids/proposals), (bidders/offerors) certify that they are not currently debarred by the Commonwealth of Virginia from submitting bids or proposals on contracts for the type of goods and/or services covered by this solicitation, nor are they an agent of any person or entity that is currently so debarred.

ANTITRUST: By entering into a contract, the contractor conveys, sells, assigns, and transfers to the City all rights, title and interest in and to all causes of action it may now have or hereafter acquire under the antitrust laws of the United States and the Commonwealth of Virginia, relating to the particular goods or services purchased or acquired by the City under said contract.

MANDATORY USE OF CITY FORM AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR IFBs AND RFPs

- 1. <u>(For Invitation For Bids(ITB)</u>:) Failure to submit a bid on the form provided, (if provided) shall be a cause for rejection of the bid. Modification of or additions to any portion of the Invitation for Bids may be cause for rejection of the bid; however, the City reserves the right to decide, on a case by case basis, in its sole discretion, whether to reject such a bid as nonresponsive. As a precondition to its acceptance, the City may, in its sole discretion, request that the bidder withdraw or modify nonresponsive portions of a bid which do not affect quality, quantity, price, or delivery. No modification of or addition to the provisions of the contract shall be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties.
- 2. <u>(For Request For Proposals(RFP)</u>:) Failure to submit a proposal on the form provided, (if provided) shall be a cause for rejection of the bid. Modification of or additions to the General Terms and Conditions of the solicitation may be cause for rejection of the proposal; however, the City reserves the right to decide, on a case by case basis, in its sole discretion, whether to reject such a proposal.

REVISIONS TO THE OFFICIAL ITB/RFP: No offeror shall modify, revise, edit or make any unauthorized change(s) to the original Official Invitation to Bid (ITB) or Official Request for Proposal (RFP). The Official solicitation document and the Addenda(s) are the documents posted on the City of Harrisonburg's web site and/or authorized by the City of Harrisonburg's Purchasing Agent. Any such violation as stated above may result in rejection of the ITB/RFP response. In addition, violations may result in the debarment of the offeror by the City of Harrisonburg.

<u>CLARIFICATION OF TERMS</u>: If any prospective (bidder/offeror) has questions about the specifications or other solicitation documents, the prospective (bidder/offeror) should contact the person whose name appears on the face of the solicitation no later than five working days before the due date. Any revisions to the solicitation will be made only by addendum issued by the buyer.

PAYMENT:

1. <u>To Prime Contractor</u>:

- a. Invoices for items ordered, delivered and accepted shall be submitted by the contractor directly to the payment address shown on the purchase order/contract. All invoices shall show the purchase order number; social security number (for individual contractors) or the federal employer identification number (for proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations).
- b. Any payment terms requiring payment in less than 30 days will be regarded as requiring payment 30 days after invoice or delivery, whichever occurs last. This shall not affect offers of discounts for payment in less than 30 days, however.
- c. All goods or services provided under this contract or purchase order, that are to be paid for with public funds, shall be billed by the contractor at the contract price.
- d. The following shall be deemed to be the date of payment: the date of postmark in all cases where payment is made by mail, or the date of offset when offset proceedings have been instituted as authorized under the Virginia Debt Collection Act.
- e. Individual contractors shall provide their social security numbers, and proprietors, partnerships, and corporations shall provide the City with a federal employer identification number, prior to receiving any payment from the City.
- f. Unreasonable Charges. Under certain emergency procurements and for most time and material purchases, final job costs cannot be accurately determined at the time orders are placed. In such cases, contractors should be put on notice that final payment in full is contingent on a determination of reasonableness with respect to all invoiced charges. Charges which appear to be unreasonable will be researched and challenged, and that portion of the invoice held in abeyance until a settlement can be reached. Upon determining that invoiced as to those charges which it considers unreasonable and the basis for the determination. A contractor may not institute legal action unless a settlement cannot be reached within thirty (30) days of notification. The provisions of this section do not relieve the City of its prompt payment obligations with respect to those charges which are not in dispute (*Code of Virginia*, 2.2.4363.

2. To Subcontractors:

- a. A contractor awarded a contract under this solicitation is hereby obligated:
- (1) To pay the subcontractor(s) within seven (7) days of the contractor's receipt of payment from the City for the proportionate share of the payment received for work performed by the subcontractor(s) under the contract; or
- (2) To notify the City and the subcontractor(s), in writing, of the contractor's intention to withhold payment and the reason.
- b. The contractor is obligated to pay the subcontractor(s) interest at the rate of one percent per month (unless otherwise provided under the terms of the contract) on all amounts owed by the contractor that remain unpaid seven (7) days following receipt of payment from the City, except for amounts withheld as stated in (2) above. The date of mailing of any payment by U. S. Mail is deemed to be payment to the addressee. These provisions apply to each sub-tier contractor performing under the primary contract. A contractor's obligation to pay an interest charge to a subcontractor may not be construed to be an obligation of the City.

PRECEDENCE OF TERMS: General Terms and Conditions shall apply in all instances. In the event there is a conflict between any of the other General Terms and Conditions and any Special Terms and Conditions in this solicitation, the Special Terms and Conditions shall apply.

QUALIFICATIONS OF (BIDDERS/OFFERORS): The City may make such reasonable investigations as deemed proper and necessary to determine the ability of the (bidder/offeror) to perform the services/furnish the goods and the (bidder/offeror) shall furnish to the City all such information and data for this purpose as may be requested. The City reserves the right to inspect (bidder's/offeror's) physical facilities prior to award to satisfy questions regarding the (bidder's/offeror's) capabilities. The City further reserves the right to reject any (bid/proposal) if the evidence submitted by, or investigations of, such (bidder/offeror) fails to satisfy the City that such (bidder/offeror) is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to provide the services and/or furnish the goods contemplated therein.

TESTING AND INSPECTION: The City reserves the right to conduct any test/inspection it may deem advisable to assure goods and services conform to the specifications.

ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT: A contract shall not be assignable by the contractor in whole or in part without the written consent of the City.

CHANGES TO THE CONTRACT: Changes can be made to the contract in any of the following ways:

- 1. The parties may agree in writing to modify the scope of the contract. An increase or decrease in the price of the contract resulting from such modification shall be agreed to by the parties as a part of their written agreement to modify the scope of the contract.
- 2. The Purchasing Agent or City delegated agent may order changes within the general scope of the contract at any time by written notice to the contractor. Changes within the scope of the contract include, but are not limited to, things such as services to be performed, the method of packing or shipment, and the place of delivery or installation. The contractor shall comply with the notice upon receipt. The contractor shall be compensated for any additional costs incurred as the result of such order and shall give the City a credit for any savings.

<u>DEFAULT</u>: In case of failure to deliver goods or services in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, the City, after due oral or written notice, may procure them from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting additional purchase and administrative costs. This remedy shall be in addition to any other remedies, which the City may have.

<u>CANCELLATION OF THE CONTRACT:</u> The City may terminate any agreement resulting from this solicitation at any time, for any reason or for no reason, upon thirty days advance written notice to the Contractor. In the event of such termination the Contractor shall be compensated for services and work performed prior to termination.

<u>TAXES</u>: Sales to the City of Harrisonburg are normally exempt from State sales tax. State sales and use tax certificates of exemption, Form ST-12, will be issued upon request.

(NOT NORMALLY REQUIRED FOR SERVICE CONTRACTS)

<u>USE OF BRAND NAMES</u>: Unless otherwise provided in this solicitation, the name of a certain brand, make or manufacturer does not restrict (bidders/offerors) to the specific brand, make or manufacturer named, but conveys the general style, type, character, and quality of the article desired. Any article which the public body,

in its sole discretion, determines to be the equal of that specified, considering quality, workmanship, economy of operation, and suitability for the purpose intended, shall be accepted. The (bidder/offeror) is responsible to clearly and specifically identify the product being offered and to provide sufficient descriptive literature, catalog cuts and technical detail to enable the City to determine if the product offered meets the requirements of the solicitation. This is required even if offering the exact brand, make or manufacturer specified. Normally in competitive sealed bidding only the information furnished with the bid will be considered in the evaluation. Failure to furnish adequate data for evaluation purposes may result in declaring a bid nonresponsive. Unless the (bidder/offeror) clearly indicates in its (bid/proposal) that the product offered is an "equal" product, such (bid/proposal) will be considered to offer the brand name product referenced in the solicitation.(NOT NORMALLY REQUIRED FOR SERVICE CONTRACTS)

TRANSPORTATION AND PACKAGING: By submitting their (bids/proposals), all (bidders/offerors) certify and warrant that the price offered for FOB destination includes only the actual freight rate costs at the lowest and best rate and is based upon the actual weight of the goods to be shipped. Except as otherwise specified herein, standard commercial packaging, packing and shipping containers shall be used. All shipping containers shall be legibly marked or labeled on the outside with purchase order number, commodity description, and quantity.(NOT NORMALLY REQUIRED FOR SERVICE CONTRACTS)

<u>INSURANCE</u>: By signing and submitting a bid or proposal under this solicitation, the bidder or offeror certifies that if awarded the contract, it will have insurance coverages per the solicitation document at the time the contract is awarded. For construction contracts, if any subcontractors are involved, the subcontractor will have workers' compensation insurance in accordance with 2.2-4332 and 65.2-800 et seq. of the *Code of Virginia*. The bidder or offeror further certifies that the contractor and any subcontractors will maintain these insurance coverages during the entire term of the contract and that all insurance coverages will be provided by insurance companies authorized to sell insurance in Virginia by the Virginia State Corporation Commission. (NOT NORMALLY REQUIRED FOR GOODS CONTRACTS. INSURANCE IS REQUIRED WHEN WORK IS TO BE PERFORMED ON CITY OWNED OR LEASED FACILITIES OR PROPERTY.)

AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS: Agreements are made subject to the appropriation of funds by the Harrisonburg City Council and are null and void in the event of non-appropriation by the City Council. Non-appropriation of funds shall not be deemed a cancellation and shall terminate this agreement without recourse and with no liability on the part of the City.

SELECTION PROCESS/AWARD: Upon the award or the announcement of the decision to award a contract as a result of this solicitation, the department will publicly post such notice for a minimum of ten (10) days, or will notify all responsive bidders/offerors.

BID/PROPOSAL ACCEPTANCE PERIOD: Any bid/proposal resulting from this solicitation shall be valid for (30) days. At the end of the (30) days the bid/proposal may be withdrawn at the written request of the Bidder/Offeror. If the bid or proposal is not withdrawn at that time it remains in effect until an award is made or the solicitation is canceled.

EXCUSABLE DELAY: The City shall not be in default of any failure in performance of this agreement in accordance with its terms if such failure arises out of causes beyond its reasonable control and without the fault of or negligence of the City. Such causes may include, but are not restricted to acts of God or the public enemy,

fires, flood, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and usually severe weather, but in every case the failure to perform must be beyond the reasonable control and without the fault or negligence of the City.

DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE: During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees to (i) provide a drug-free workplace for the contractor's employees; (ii) post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, a statement notifying employees that the unlawful manufacture, sale, distribution, dispensation, possession, or use of a controlled substance or marijuana is prohibited in the contractor's workplace and specifying the actions that will be taken against employees for violations of such prohibition; (iii) state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor that the contractor maintains a drug-free workplace; and (iv) include the provisions of the foregoing clauses in every subcontract or purchase order of over \$10,000, so that the provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor.

SAFETY and OSHA STANDARDS: All parties performing services for the City shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA), State Occupational Health Standards, and any other applicable rules and regulations. All parties shall be held responsible for the training, supervision, and safety of their employees.
