2. DESCRIPTION OF WORK

Provisions and installation of plant-mix asphalt concrete paving SM 9.5AL, plant-mix asphalt concrete paving SM 12.5D, plant-mix asphalt concrete paving SMA and pavement planning (milling) of in-place asphalt concrete pavement, together with all required traffic control and other incidental items required to complete the work.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. SECURING DOCUMENTS

Bid documents are available for viewing on the internet at www.harrisonburgva.gov/bids-proposals and also on the eVA website at www.eva.virginia.gov, or at the Department of Public Works, 320 East Mosby Road.

2. BIDDER ELIGIBILITY

A. Bids

Bids will only be accepted from Contractors who are experienced in and actively engaged in the type of construction of the item(s) called for in the bid. No proposal will be accepted from or contract awarded to any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears or is in default to the City upon any debt or contract, or that is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to said City or had failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the City. Where an installation or assembly is to be performed by a subcontractor, the bidder must name the subcontractor, and the City reserves the right to determine whether the named subcontractor is fit and capable to perform the required work. Bidders and subcontractors must be prequalified with VDOT to be considered responsive bidders on this project. A copy of the bidder's VDOT Certificate of Qualifications must be submitted with the bid documents.

B. Bidders are required under Chapter 11, Title 54, Code of Virginia, to show evidence of certificate of registration before bid may be received and considered.

C. Bidders must certify in the bid form that they are not currently barred from bidding on contracts by any agency of the Commonwealth of Virginia or any federal agency.

3. BID FORM AND SUBMISSION

In order to receive consideration, submit bids in accordance with the following:

A. Make bids upon the forms provided herewith, properly signed and with all items filled out. Do not change the wording of the bid form, and do not add words to the bid form. Unauthorized conditions, limitations, or provisions attached to the bid will be cause for rejection of the bid.

B. Address bids to the Owner, and deliver to the address specified in the invitation to bid on or before the day and hour set for opening the bids. Enclose each bid in a sealed envelope bearing the title of the Work, the project number(s), the name of the bidder, Virginia contractor registration number and the date and hour of the bid opening. Submit only the original signed copy of the bid. It is the sole responsibility of the bidder to see that his bid is received on time. No faxed bid will be considered. No bids received after the time fixed for receiving them will be considered. Late or incomplete bids will be returned to the bidder.

- C. Indicate receipt of issued Addenda. All Bidders are cautioned to check at www.harrisonburgva.gov/bids-proposals or at www.eva.virginia.gov to assure that all Addenda have been received and that the cost consequences thereof have been included in the bid.
- D. Although the bid is based upon unit prices, many items are to be priced under lump sum designations. It is the bidder's responsibility to verify the exact scope of work for all items in order to establish a bid price.
- E. The following documents fully completed and signed where appropriate are required for a responsive bid:
 - i) Signed Cover Sheet
 - ii) Bid Form
 - iii) Bid Tab
 - iv) Bid Bond
 - v) Contractor Eligibility and Registration
 - vi) State Corporation Commission Registration

4. BONDS

- A. Bid security in the amount stated in the Invitation to Bid must accompany each bid. The successful bidder's security will not be returned until he has signed the Contract and has furnished the required Certificates of Insurance.
- B. The Owner reserves the right to retain the security of all bidders until the successful bidder enters into the Contract or until 90 days after bid opening, whichever is sooner. Other bid security will be returned as soon as practicable. If any bidder refuses to enter into a Contract, the Owner may retain his bid security as liquidated damages but not as a penalty.
- C. Prior to signing the Contract, the Owner will require the successful bidder to secure and post a Labor and Materials Payment Bond and a Performance Bond, each in the amount of 100% of the Contract Sum, and each on the form provided therefore in the Project Manual. Such Bonds shall be issued by a Surety acceptable to the Owner.

5. EXAMINATION OF DOCUMENTS AND SITE OF WORK

Before submitting a bid, each bidder shall examine the Drawings carefully, shall read the Project Manual and all other proposed Contract Documents, and shall visit the site of the Work. Each bidder shall fully inform himself prior to bidding as to existing conditions and limitations under which the Work is to be performed, and shall include in his bid a sum to cover the cost of items necessary to perform the Work as set forth in the proposed Contract Documents. No allowance will be made to a bidder because of lack of such examination and knowledge. The submission of a bid will be considered as conclusive evidence that the bidder has made such examination.

6. MODIFICATION AND WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

- A. Bidder may modify or withdraw his bid, either personally or by written request, at any time prior to the scheduled time for opening of bids.
- B. Except as provided in 2.2-4330 of the Code of Virginia, no bidder may withdraw his bid for a period of thirty calendar days after the date set for opening thereof, and bids shall be subject to acceptance by Owner during this period. Refusal of acceptance will result in forfeiture of bid security.

7. INTERPRETATION OF CONTRACT DOCUMENTS PRIOR TO BIDDING

If any person contemplating submitting a bid for construction of the Work is in doubt as to the true meaning of any part of the proposed Contract Documents, or finds discrepancies on or omissions from any part of the proposed Contract Documents, he shall submit to the Contract Administrator a written request for as outlined in the invitation to bid. The person submitting the request shall be responsible for any other interpretations of the proposed Contract Documents. Questions will be answered in Addendum format and posted as outlined in the invitation to bid, at www.harrisingurgva.gov/bids-proposals.

8. AWARD OF CONTRACT

The Contract, if awarded, will be awarded to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, meeting all specifications, subject to the Owner's right to reject any or all bids and to waive informality and irregularity in the bids and in the bidding.

9. EXECUTION OF AGREEMENT

- A. The form of the Agreement which the successful bidder will be required to execute is included in the Project Manual.
- B. The bidder to whom the Contract is awarded shall, within ten calendar days after notice of award and receipt of Agreement forms from the Owner, sign and deliver required copies to the Owner.
- C. At or prior to delivery of the signed Agreement, the bidder to whom the Contract is awarded shall deliver to the Owner those Certificates of Insurance required by the Contract Documents and such Labor and Materials Payment Bonds and Performance Bond and City Business License, as are required by the Owner.
- D. Bonds and Certificates of Insurance shall be approved by the Owner before the successful bidder may proceed with the Work. Failure or refusal to provide Bonds or Certificates of Insurance in a form satisfactory to the Owner shall subject the successful bidder to loss of time from the allowable construction period equal to the time of delay in furnishing the required material.
- E. The Agreement will include a clause which allows for extension of the Contract on a yearly basis for a period of up to six years. Such extension will be contingent upon

acceptable performance and successful negotiation of yearly contract unit prices. Such prices shall be based upon a proposed annual work schedule to be provided to the Contractor at time of extension. Minor revisions to Project Manual shall be made at time of extension as necessary to maintain quality control and overall performance of Contractor.

11. CONSTRUCTION TIME AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

- A. The Agreement includes a stipulation that all Work be completed by a specified date (see section 0501). Liquidated damages will be applied as specified section 0501. The contractor is not to begin work until the receipt of the Owner's Notice to Proceed which will be effective upon receipt.

12. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance Requirements for the City of Harrisonburg

Independent Contractors/Vendors must have the following insurance coverages before beginning work on City premises:

- 1.) The contractor/vendor will maintain a general liability policy with \$1,000,000 combined single limits. Coverage is to be on an occurrence basis with an insurer licensed to conduct business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Excess Liability coverage in the amount of \$1,000,000. The insurer must have an A. M. Best rating of A- or better. **The insurer must list the City of Harrisonburg as an additional insured. The endorsement must be issued by the insurance company. A notation on the certificate of insurance is not sufficient.**
- 2.) The contractor/vendor will maintain workers' compensation coverage in compliance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia. The coverage must have statutory limits and be with an insurer licensed to conduct business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The insurer must have an A. M. Best rating of A- or better. As an alternative, it is acceptable for the contractor to be insured by a group self insurance association that is licensed by the Virginia Bureau of Insurance. The contractor will also carry employers liability insurance with a limit of at least \$100,000 bodily injury by accident/\$500,000 bodily injury by disease policy limit/\$100,000 bodily injury by disease each employee.
- 3.) The contractor/vendor will maintain automobile liability insurance with limits of at least \$1,000,000. The coverage is to be written with a symbol "1". The insurer must be licensed to conduct business in the Commonwealth of Virginia. The insurer must have an A. M. Best rating of A- or better.

13. CITY BUSINESS LICENSE

Work in this project shall conform to the latest editions of the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) Road and Bridge specifications, the VDOT road and bridge standards, the Virginia Erosion and Sediment Control handbook, the Virginia Erosion and Sediment Control regulations and the City of Harrisonburg design and construction standards manual. In the event of conflict between any of these standards, specifications or plans, the most stringent shall govern.

16. CONSIDERATION OF PROJECT COMPLEXITIES

- A. In preparing this bid, Contractor shall understand and account in his costs for the complexities involved in administrating the construction required by this Contract. Contractor shall be aware that the project area receives heavy vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Contractor shall accommodate such traffic through and around the work area in a safe and well-marked manner.
- B. Submission of a bid shall be an affirmation that the Contractor understands these complexities and difficulties associated with this project, that he has included in his bid a sufficient dollar amount to compensate for the additional time and effort these complexities and difficulties will require on his part, and that he understands that the Owner will not accept any claim for time extension or additional costs associated with them.

0501 AGREEMENT

This AGREEMENT is dated as of the ___ day of _____ in the year 20__ between the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia (hereinafter called OWNER) and _____ (hereinafter called CONTRACTOR). OWNER and CONTRACTOR, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1. WORK

CONTRACTOR shall complete all Work as specified or indicated in the Contract Documents for the project titled Annual Street Paving Services. The Work is generally described as follows:

Provisions and installation of plant-mix asphalt concrete paving SM 9.5AL, plant-mix asphalt concrete paving SM 12.5D, plant mix asphalt concrete paving SMA, and pavement planning (milling) of in-place asphalt concrete pavement, together with all required traffic control and other incidental items required to complete the work.

This work shall include a provision for the installation of plant-mix asphalt on an as needed emergency basis, such as waterline breaks, large pavement failures or other types of pavement related issues. The contract unit prices shall be used and will include all traffic control and other incidental items required to complete the work.

ARTICLE 2. CONTRACT ADMINSTRATOR

This Project has been designed by the City of Harrisonburg and administered by the Department of Public Works. The Director of Public Works of Harrisonburg, Virginia, or their designee, is hereinafter called CONTRACT ADMINSTRATOR, will assume all duties and responsibilities and will have the rights and authority assigned to CONTRACT ADMINSTRATOR in the Contract Documents in connection with completion of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 3. CONSTRUCTION TIME AND LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

3.1 Contract Time shall be Fixed Completion Dates for the various phases of work as follows:

Phase 1 Streets as identified in the attached Paving Schedule shall be complete on or before July 15th of the contract year.

Phase 2 Streets as identified in the attached Paving Schedule shall be completed on or before October 1st of the contract year.

Phase 3 Streets as identified in the attached Paving Schedule shall be completed on or before November 15th of the contract year.

3.2 In the event the Contractor does not complete either Phase 1 or Phase 2 streets by the date listed above the City will access a fee of \$600.00 per day until the work in the Phase is

complete. In the event the Contractor does not complete the Phase 3 streets by the date listed above the liquidated damages mentioned below shall be applied.

- 3.3 Liquidated Damages. Shall be applied to the contract if the required work is not completed by the date specified in paragraph 3.1, and assessed at \$600.00 per day until the work is complete.

ARTICLE 4. CONTRACT PRICE

- 4.1 OWNER shall pay CONTRACTOR for performance of the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents such amounts as required by the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 5. PAYMENT PROCEDURES

CONTRACTOR shall submit Applications for Payment in accordance with Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications. Applications for Payment will be processed by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR as provided in the Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications.

- 5.1 Progress Payments. OWNER shall make progress payments on account of the Contract Price on the basis of CONTRACTOR'S Applications for Payment as recommended by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR, on or about the 1st day of each month during construction as provided below. All Progress Payments will be on the basis of the progress of the Work measured by the schedule of values established in Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications.

- 5.1.1 Prior to completion Progress Payments will be made in an amount equal to:

95% of the Work completed, and

95% of the materials and equipment not incorporated in the Work but delivered and suitably stored less in each case the aggregate of payment previously made.

- 5.1.2 Upon substantial completion, OWNER shall pay amount sufficient to increase total payments to CONTRACTOR to 98% of the Contract Price, less such amount as CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR shall determine in accordance with Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications.

- 5.2. Final Payment. Upon final completion and acceptance of the Work in accordance with the Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications, OWNER shall pay the remainder of the Contract Price as recommended by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR as provided in said Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications.

ARTICLE 6. INTEREST

All monies not paid when due hereunder shall bear interest at maximum rate allowed by law at the place of the Project.

ARTICLE 7. CONTRACTOR'S REPRESENTATIONS

In order to induce OWNER to enter into this Agreement, CONTRACTOR makes the following representations:

7.1 CONTRACTOR has familiarized himself with the nature and extent of the Contract Documents, Work, locality, and with all local conditions, state and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations that in any manner may affect cost, progress or performance of the Work.

7.2 CONTRACTOR has studied carefully all reports of investigations and tests of subsurface and latent physical conditions at the site or otherwise affecting cost, progress or performance of the Work which were relied upon by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR in the preparation of the Drawings and Specifications and which have been identified in the Supplementary Conditions.

7.3 CONTRACTOR has made or caused to be made examinations, investigations and tests and studies of such reports and related data in addition to those referred to in Paragraph 7.2. as he deems necessary for the performance of the Work at the Contract Price, within the Contract Time and in accordance with the other terms and conditions of the Contract Documents; and no additional examination, investigations, tests, reports or similar data are or will be required by CONTRACTOR for such purposes.

7.4 CONTRACTOR has correlated the results of all such observations, examinations, investigations, tests, reports and data with the terms and conditions of the Contract Documents.

7.5 CONTRACTOR has given CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR written notice of all conflicts, errors or discrepancies that he has discovered in the Contract Documents and the written resolution thereof by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR is acceptable to CONTRACTOR.

ARTICLE 8. CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

The Contract Documents which comprise the entire agreement between OWNER and CONTRACTOR are attached by reference to this Agreement, made a part hereof and consist of the following:

All contract documents must be listed in this article. Contract documents may be altered, amended or repealed only as allowed by the Virginia Department of Transportation's Road & Bridge Specifications.

ARTICLE 9. MISCELLANEOUS

9.1 No assignment by a party hereto of any rights under or interests in the Contract Documents will be binding on another party hereto without the written consent of the party sought to be bound; and specifically but without limitation, monies that may become due and monies that are now due may not be assigned without such consent (except to the extent that the effect of this restriction may be limited by law), and unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under the Contract Documents.

9.2 OWNER and CONTRACTOR each binds himself, his partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives to the party hereto, his partners, successors, assigns and legal representatives in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations contained in the Contract Documents.

9.3 This Agreement may be extended, on an annual basis, for a period of up to six (6) years from the initial contract award date, contingent upon acceptable performance and successful negotiation of yearly contract unit prices.

ARTICLE 10. OTHER PROVISIONS

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have signed this Agreement in triplicate. One counterpart each has been delivered to OWNER, CONTRACTOR and CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR. All portions of the Contract Documents have been signed or identified by OWNER and CONTRACTOR or by CONTRACT ADMINISTRATOR on their behalf.

PURCHASING AND CONTRACTING MANUAL: This solicitation is subject to the provisions of The Purchasing and Contracting Policy Manual for the City of Harrisonburg (City) and any revisions thereto, which are hereby incorporated into this contract in their entirety. A copy of the manual is available for review at www.Harrisonburgva.gov/bids.

APPLICABLE LAWS AND COURTS: This solicitation and any resulting contract shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia and any litigation with respect thereto shall be brought in the courts of the Commonwealth. The contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations.

ANTI-DISCRIMINATION: By submitting their (bids/proposals), (bidders/offerors) certify to the City that they will conform to the provisions of the Federal Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, as well as the Virginia Fair Employment Contracting Act of 1975, as amended, where applicable, the Virginians With Disabilities Act, the Americans With Disabilities Act and 2.2-4311 of the *Virginia Public Procurement Act*.

In every contract over \$10,000 the provisions below apply:

MANDATORY USE OF CITY FORM AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR IFBs AND RFPs

1. **(For Invitation For Bids(ITB):)** Failure to submit a bid on the form provided, (if provided) shall be a cause for rejection of the bid. Modification of or additions to any portion of the Invitation for Bids may be cause for rejection of the bid; however, the City reserves the right to decide, on a case by case basis, in its sole discretion, whether to reject such a bid as nonresponsive. As a precondition to its acceptance, the City may, in its sole discretion, request that the bidder withdraw or modify nonresponsive portions of a bid which do not affect quality, quantity, price, or delivery. No modification of or addition to the provisions of the contract shall be effective unless reduced to writing and signed by the parties.
2. **(For Request For Proposals(RFP):)** Failure to submit a proposal on the form provided, (if provided) shall be a cause for rejection of the bid. Modification of or additions to the General Terms and Conditions of the solicitation may be cause for rejection of the proposal; however, the City reserves the right to decide, on a case by case basis, in its sole discretion, whether to reject such a proposal.

REVISIONS TO THE OFFICIAL ITB/RFP: No offeror shall modify, revise, edit or make any unauthorized change(s) to the original Official Invitation to Bid (ITB) or Official Request for Proposal (RFP). The Official solicitation document and the Addenda(s) are the

documents posted on the City of Harrisonburg's web site and/or authorized by the City of Harrisonburg's Purchasing Agent. Any such violation as stated above may result in rejection of the ITB/RFP response. In addition, violations may result in the debarment of the offeror by the City of Harrisonburg.

CLARIFICATION OF TERMS: If any prospective (bidder/offeror) has questions about the specifications or other solicitation documents, the prospective (bidder/offeror) should contact the person whose name appears on the face of the solicitation no later than five working days before the due date. Any revisions to the solicitation will be made only by addendum issued by the buyer.

PAYMENT:

1. To Prime Contractor:

- a. Invoices for items ordered, delivered and accepted shall be submitted by the contractor directly to the payment address shown on the purchase order/contract. All invoices shall show the purchase order number; social security number (for individual contractors) or the federal employer identification number (for proprietorships, partnerships, and corporations).
- b. Any payment terms requiring payment in less than 30 days will be regarded as requiring payment 30 days after invoice or delivery, whichever occurs last. This shall not affect offers of discounts for payment in less than 30 days, however.
- c. All goods or services provided under this contract or purchase order, that are to be paid for with public funds, shall be billed by the contractor at the contract price.
- d. The following shall be deemed to be the date of payment: the date of postmark in all cases where payment is made by mail, or the date of offset when offset proceedings have been instituted as authorized under the Virginia Debt Collection Act.
- e. Individual contractors shall provide their social security numbers, and proprietors, partnerships, and corporations shall provide the City with a federal employer identification number, prior to receiving any payment from the City.
- f. **Unreasonable Charges.** Under certain emergency procurements and for most time and material purchases, final job costs cannot be accurately determined at the time orders are placed. In such cases, contractors should be put on notice that final payment in full is contingent on a determination of reasonableness with respect to all invoiced charges. Charges which appear to be unreasonable will be researched and challenged, and that portion of the invoice held in abeyance until a settlement can be reached. The contractor is obligated to pay the subcontractor(s) interest at the rate of one percent per month (unless otherwise provided under the terms of the contract) on all amounts owed by the contractor that remain unpaid seven (7) days following receipt of payment from the City, except for amounts withheld as stated in (2) above. The date of mailing of any payment by U. S. Mail is deemed to be payment to the addressee. These provisions apply to each sub-tier contractor performing under the primary contract. A contractor's obligation to pay an interest charge to a subcontractor may not be construed to be an obligation of the City.

PRECEDENCE OF TERMS: General Terms and Conditions shall apply in all instances. In the event there is a conflict between any of the other General Terms and Conditions and any Special Terms and Conditions in this solicitation, the Special Terms and Conditions shall apply.

QUALIFICATIONS OF (BIDDERS/OFFERORS): The City may make such reasonable investigations as deemed proper and necessary to determine the ability of the (bidder/offeror) to perform the services/furnish the goods and the (bidder/offeror) shall furnish to the City all such information and data for this purpose as may be requested. The City reserves the right to inspect (bidder's/offeror's) physical facilities prior to award to satisfy questions regarding the (bidder's/offeror's) capabilities. The City further reserves the right to reject any (bid/ proposal) if the evidence submitted by, or investigations of, such (bidder/offeror) fails to satisfy the City that such (bidder/offeror) is properly qualified to carry out the obligations of the contract and to provide the services and/or furnish the goods contemplated therein.

TESTING AND INSPECTION: The City reserves the right to conduct any test/inspection it may deem advisable to assure goods and services conform to the specifications.

ASSIGNMENT OF CONTRACT: A contract shall not be assignable by the contractor in whole or in part without the written consent of the City.

CHANGES TO THE CONTRACT: Changes can be made to the contract in any of the following ways:

1. The parties may agree in writing to modify the scope of the contract. An increase or decrease in the price of the contract resulting from such modification shall be agreed to by the parties as a part of their written agreement to modify the scope of the contract.
2. The Purchasing Agent or City delegated agent may order changes within the general scope of the contract at any time by written notice to the contractor. Changes within the scope of the contract include, but are not limited to, things such as services to be performed, the method of packing or shipment, and the place of delivery or installation. The contractor shall comply with the notice upon receipt. The contractor shall be compensated for any additional costs incurred as the result of such order and shall give the City a credit for any savings.

DEFAULT: In case of failure to deliver goods or services in accordance with the contract terms and conditions, the City, after due oral or written notice, may procure them from other sources and hold the contractor responsible for any resulting additional purchase and administrative costs. This remedy shall be in addition to any other remedies, which the City may have.

Any article which the public body, in its sole discretion, determines to be the equal of that specified, considering quality, workmanship, economy of operation, and suitability for the purpose intended, shall be accepted. Except as otherwise specified herein, standard commercial packaging, packing and shipping containers shall be used. The successful bidder has the option to provide these same items (services), except architectural and engineering services, at the same prices, awarded as a result of this solicitation to any public body within the Commonwealth of Virginia. If any other Public body decides to use the final contract, the contractor(s) must deal directly with that public body concerning the placement of orders, issuance of the purchase orders, contractual disputes, invoicing and payment. Failure to extend a contract to any public body will have no effect on consideration of your bid.

LIABILITY AND LITIGATION: The City shall not indemnify or hold harmless any Contractor or other third party. The City does not waive any right or release any party from liability, whether on its own behalf or on behalf of any boards, employees or agents. The City does not waive the right to trial by jury for any cause of action arising from the Contract and shall not submit any Contract claim to binding arbitration or mediation. The City shall not be liable to Contractor for any special, punitive or exemplary damages arising from the performance of the contract, including, but not limited to, incidental damages, and lost profit and lost wages, even if such special damages are reasonably foreseeable. Any provision(s) in the Contract contrary to these statements is/are hereby deleted and rendered void.

STATE CORPORATION COMMISSION IDENTIFICATION NUMBER: Pursuant to Code of VA 2.2-4311.2 subsection B, a bidder or offeror organized or authorized to transact

Asphalt material bid items designated in the contract as Price Adjustment Items will be subject to price adjustment as set forth herein. Other items will not be adjusted, except as otherwise specified in the contract. If new pay items which contain asphalt material are established by Work Order, they will not be subject to Price Adjustment unless specifically designated in the Work Order to be subject to Price Adjustment.

Each month, the Department will publish an average state-wide PG 64-22 f.o.b. price per ton developed from the average terminal prices provided to the Department from suppliers of asphalt cement to contractors doing work in Virginia. The Department will collect terminal prices from approximately 12 terminals each month. These prices will be received once each month from suppliers on or about the last weekday of the month. The high and low prices will be eliminated and the remaining values averaged to establish the average statewide price for the following month. That monthly state-wide average price will be posted on the Scheduling and Contract Division website on or about the first weekday of the following month.

This monthly statewide average price will be the Base Index for all contracts on which bids are received during the calendar month of its posting and will be the Current Index for all asphalt placed during the calendar month of its posting. In the event an index changes radically from the apparent trend, as determined by the Engineer, the Department may establish an index which it determines to best reflect the trend.

The amount of adjustment applied will be based on the difference between the contract Base Index and the Current Index for the applicable calendar month during which the work is performed. Adjustment of any asphalt material item designated as a price adjustment item which does not contain PG 64-22, except PG 76-22, will be based on the indexes for PG 64-22. The quantity of asphalt cement for asphalt concrete pavement to which adjustment will be applied will be the quantity based on the percent of asphalt cement shown on the appropriate approved job mix formula.

The quantity of asphalt emulsion for surface treatments to which adjustment will be applied will be the quantity based on 65 percent residual asphalt.

Price adjustment will be shown as a separate entry on the monthly progress estimate; however, such adjustment will not be included in the total cost of the work for progress determination or for extension of contract time.

Any apparent attempt to unbalance bids in favor of items subject to price adjustment or failure to submit required cost and price data as noted hereinbefore may result in rejection of the bid proposal.

SECTION 02900
UTILITY FIELD ADJUSTMENTS

PART 1 – GENERAL

1.01 DESCRIPTION

- A. This Work consists of providing water and sewer utility grade adjustments as required for coordination of the city of Harrisonburg, VA annual pavement resurfacing program.

PART 2 – PRODUCTS

- A. All material shall conform to the City of Harrisonburg, Virginia Design and Construction Standards Manual, latest edition.

PART 3 – EXECUTION

3.01 GENERAL

- A. The contractor shall provide all materials (except as specified otherwise), equipment and labor as necessary to complete the following water and sewer utility adjustments in coordination with the City of Harrisonburg, VA, annual repaving schedule:
- 1) Manhole adjustments with extension rings
 - 2) Valve box adapter adjustments with extension rings
 - 3) Manhole adjustments by rebuild
 - 4) Valve box adjustments by rebuild
- B. The City of Harrisonburg Department of Public Utilities shall provide all castings to be received by the contractor at the Water and Sewer Operation Center, (2155 Beery Road, Harrisonburg, VA). The contractor shall be responsible to obtain a materials authorization from the city job site representative and then to transport the material to the site upon appropriate written requisition / material receipt.
- C. The contractor shall return (to the same operations) center all casting material removed from the field. In addition, the contractor shall return any balance of materials received from the owner but not used in the field, otherwise, the contractor shall be subject to replacement charges against the contract.
- D. The contractor shall be responsible to protect all existing facilities, which have been identified and located within the paving area. In the event of such damage, the city will provide the materials at a charge against the contract equal to material cost. The contractor shall make the repair at no additional charge to the owner; the contractor shall receive payment for the scope of work required if the facility had not been damaged.

To facilitate the contractor with locations, Appendix C includes itemization of maps of valve boxes and manholes. In addition, a city representative shall be available to review and locate the work at a sufficient time preceding commencement of the actual work.

- E. During the period between completion of the utility work and the completion of paving work, the contractor shall maintain traffic safety as directed by the most current edition of the Work Area Protection Manual.
- F. The final product shall be:
- 1) Completely visible.
 - 2) Accessible through the lid.
 - 3) Absent of movement or rattle to traffic.
 - 4) Flush to minus ¼ inch with the final pavement surface.

- 5) Clean and free of dirt, gravel and tar on the seats.

3.02 MANHOLE ADJUSTMENTS WITH EXTENSION RINGS

- A. Manhole extension rings shall be used only where approved by the city representative.
- B. Extension rings (to be provided by the city) shall be 1 ½ or 2 inches in height.
- C. The maximum number of stacked extension rings shall be three (3). If scenario exceeds maximum, revert to “Adjustment by Rebuild”.
- D. Payment for this work shall be included in the tonnage cost of asphalt.

3.03 VALVE BOX ADAPTER ADJUSTMENTS WITH EXTENSION RINGS

- A. Valve box extension rings shall be used only where approved by the city representative
- B. Castings to be provided by the city shall include as necessary:
 - 1 inch by 6 inch Valve Box Adapters
 - 1 ¾ inch by 6 inch Valve Box Adapters
 - 1 ¾ inch by 12 inch Valve Box Adapters
 - ¾ inch Valve Box Raising Rings
 - Valve Box Lids
- C. For all ring / adapter installations, the adapter must penetrate the box a minimum of 2 inches below the original lid seat.
- D. The contractor shall be responsible to make all field cuts to adapters, which are too long for shallow depth valves.
- E. The contractor shall be responsible for cutting the asphalt around the valve box adapter, removing adapter, installing necessary riser rings, reinstalling adapter to grade of asphalt overlay, and backfilling cut area with asphalt.
- F. Payment for this work shall be included in the tonnage cost of asphalt.

3.04 MANHOLE ADJUSTMENTS BY REBUILD

- A. Manhole adjustment shall be made by rebuild procedures only upon authorization by the city representative. In general, rebuild will be authorized when:
 - 1) Extension rings exceed the maximum allowance of three (3).
 - 2) The existing frame type fails to meet city standards.
 - 3) The existing frame is structurally or functionally defective.
 - 4) The proposed paving crown dictates the use of rebuild procedures to provide an acceptable product.
- B. Castings (provided by the city) shall be set in quick set, non-shrinking grout. Existing concrete and/or masonry bearing surface shall be cleaned of all loose or foreign materials and wetted prior to grout placement.
- C. Height adjustments shall be made using grouted bricks, brick pavers, solid blocks or concrete adjustment rings (donuts). Concrete adjustment rings shall be provided only at the discretion of the city and shall not exceed 12 inches maximum total stacked height.

For existing conditions where adjustment rings exceed the 12 inch maximum, the condition shall be grandfathered with the use of extension rings and shall therefore not require remediation for sole purpose of reducing donuts.

- D. The frame to cone joint shall receive a trowel type finish of the grout on the interior. All grout, which falls into the manhole, shall be removed. Exterior exposed masonry and joint interface to be coated with approved bitumastic.
- E. Upon installation, the excavation shall be backfilled with 21 A stone to subgrade stone. Asphalt shall be used to match existing surface finish depth, however, not less than 4 inches minimum. For protection of traffic safety, asphalt shall be tapered to meet specification Section 02701.
- F. All ancillary work, which is necessary for the manhole itself, should be brought to the attention of the city representative. This work is not included in the scope of the bid.
- G. Payment unit shall be for all material, equipment and labor to raise one manhole.

3.05 VALVE BOX ADJUSTMENT BY REBUILD

- A. Valve box adjustments shall be made by rebuild procedures only upon authorization by the city representative. In general, rebuild will be authorized when:
 - 1) Adapters fail to penetrate the box top with a minimum 2-inch requirement.
 - 2) The existing valve box fails to meet city standard slide type unit.
 - 3) The existing valve box is structurally or functionally defective.
 - 4) The proposed paving crown dictates the use of rebuild procedures to provide an acceptable product.
 - 5) The valve nut cannot be accessed with a valve wrench for purpose of opening or closing the valve.
- B. Castings (provided by the city) shall be installed not to transmit loads on the valve.

Castings to be available include:
 - 1) 10 ½ inch Valve Box Tops
 - 2) 15 ½ inch Valve Box Tops
 - 3) Valve Box Bottoms
 - 4) Valve Box Lids
- C. To avoid loads on the valve, a 4-inch minimum of 21 A stone beneath bricks shall be used to transmit loads from the brick to the soil. The brick shall transmit load from the box to the stone; 4 bricks shall be provided for equal and level adjustment. The same principle shall be used at the bottom of the valve box top.
- D. No extension material shall be used when a rebuild procedure is made.
- E. The contractor shall be responsible for field cuts necessary on shallow valve installations; only the valve bottom casting shall be cut. Under specific circumstances of shallow depth, it may be necessary to use only a top section, thus abandoning the bottom. Such application must be approved by the city representative.
- F. Upon installation, the excavation shall be backfilled with 21 A stone to subgrade stone. Asphalt shall be used to match existing surface finish depth, however, not less than 4 inches minimum. For protection of traffic safety, asphalt shall be tapered to meet specifications Section 02701.
- G. Remediation of leaking valves and adjustments to valves exceeding 5 feet depth require ancillary work not included in the scope of the bid. This work shall be brought to the attention of the city representative for resolution.
- H. Payment unit shall be for all material, equipment and labor to raise one valve box.
