Based on the information received from GIS and the City Attorney, the Electoral Board withdraws the previous recommendation submitted to Council.

The new recommendation is as follows:

A precinct be established on the campus of JMU that would include students with 800 South Main Street addresses and including the "Hillcrest neighborhood" bordering South Main Street, Port Republic Road and the JMU Campus.

## Pro Comments for establishing a Precinct on JMU Campus

The Electoral Board should be encouraging increased voter participation. Adding a precinct to the campus of JMU will provide easier accessibility to the on-campus students. The potential pool of on campus housing voters is approximately 6000 according to the administration of JMU.

Harrisonburg has a low percent voter turnout. Easing accessibility to the polling location could help to increase the student participation in voting and help the overall percentage of voter turnout for the City.

Typically the majority of students living in on-campus housing are freshman and new to their community. There are hurdles unique to freshman college students who are just becoming familiar with the geography of their new community. Students can become more aware and feel more ownership of local laws and practices if they become more engaged in their community by voting.

At the present time we do not have any data to give a realistic picture of what increase in student voter participation could take place if a precinct is located on campus. The only way we will know the impact of having an on-campus precinct is to establish the precinct and then compare data to the current turnout data.

There is often confusion for students when registering to vote. This can result in students finding they are not on the pollbook. When this happens, students are asked to step aside and a Chief Officer has to be available to offer a Provisional Ballot. There tends to be more backup and waiting when there is more need to cast a Provisional Ballot. Having a larger number of first time voters at the same on-campus precinct could help the situation for other voters at the current Spotswood Precinct to avoid delays. At the present time a number of the Provisional Ballots cast are from students.

JMU is willing to reimburse the City for costs related to establishing a new precinct on campus and for the yearly costs therefore this precinct could be established without cost to the city and its taxpayers.

In 2011 over 3200 students registered to vote. Less than 200 voted. There should be an increase in the voter participation by having a precinct on campus.

Hopefully by helping to educate and facilitate the vote by young people impacted by adding a conveniently located more accessible Precinct on campus, we can begin a process that they will carry with them in the future. In supporting JMU's Civic Engagement Initiative, we are encouraging the students to become voting citizens in Harrisonburg where they will also engage with pride and eagerness in their community and to become more aware of the local government processes.

## Points Against Establishing a Voter Precinct on JMU Campus

- The issue is not about “voter rights” but “voter privilege”. JMU students are already voting in the city at the Spotswood Elementary School precinct.
- Establishing a distinct and separate precinct on JMU campus sets an outstanding precedent, i.e. if you can pay for it the city will do it. Objections to consider:
  - Could a neighborhood request their own precinct if they agreed to pay for it?
  - Could another institution, VMRC perhaps, request a precinct if they agreed to pay for it?
  - Instead of fostering JMU’s intended plan to interface more with the community, this request actually provides more exclusion and separation for the JMU community.
  - We are providing more convenience for JMU students than we provide for our own registered voters.
  - Other registered voters will view this as another accommodation to JMU rather than an action based on what is most appropriate for the city voters.
- The impression has been given that most state colleges\universities have their own polling place on campus exclusively for students, the reality is that only one state-owned college\university does: VPI. Liberty University, which is a private university, also has its own precinct exclusively for students. Two other state universities, UVA and George Mason, have an on-campus precinct but they are for students and local residents, not just students.
- While some registered voters in our precincts have to travel from 1.2-3.0 miles to get to their respective polling place, JMU students from the farthest point on campus have to travel only 0.8 miles. In fact, on-campus students are closer to their current precinct than the majority of city voters are to theirs.
- With a precinct selectively placed on JMU’s campus for its students, the impact on an election in which a JMU professor or employee is running for local office has the potential of wresting the control of City Council from the local registered voters to the JMU students. Additionally, a JMU student could win a seat on City Council based on JMU votes entirely.

- Based on past voting records, the request would not have merited the Electoral Board's investigation.
  - In 2014, 173 of 2240 (8%) registered on-campus students voted.
  - In 2013, 263 of 2250 (12%) registered on-campus students voted.
  - In 2012, 883 of 2320 (38%) registered on-campus students voted in the Presidential Election
  
- Currently, city precincts are established for a maximum of 5000 registered voters. In 2014, there were 2240 on-campus registered voters at JMU. Removing that many from the polls at Spotswood would necessitate a redistricting of all the polls in the city. Since this will probably need to be repeated after the 2020 census, the question arises as to why it should be done twice in 4 years.
  
- The impact on local elections from the JMU campus is significant. While past voting records indicate only a yearly average of 330 on-campus students voting, many local elections have been shifted by less than 150 votes.
  
- Instead of the time and expense of a separate precinct on JMU's campus, busing can be provided for the students to their polling station, Spotswood Elementary School, at no expense to the students.

### Board To Talk Precinct With JMU Officials

HARRISONBURG - The Harrisonburg Electoral Board has input from the Voter Registrar on the merit of a new precinct for James Madison University students. But members are not ready to make a recommendation to City Council. On Wednesday, the board voted to meet with city officials and JMU representatives by its July meeting about creating a precinct either exclusively for on-campus students or one that also encompasses surrounding neighborhoods.

The next meeting date has not been set, board member Sandra Price-Stroble said.

Last month, City Council asked the board to make a recommendation on the proposal, but the elections panel decided to wait until it could talk with more stakeholders.

"One of the things that has bothered me from the very beginning with this is the lack of actual involvement by the university," board Chairman Greg Coffman said.

He said that he did not consider the board's communication with student Josh Humphries and the JMU Student Government Association as university involvement.

Humphries originally submitted the request on behalf of SGA in March, and the board has treated the issue as an ongoing agenda item.

In a report to the board Wednesday, Registrar Deborah Logan said a new precinct for on-campus students is not justified given historically low student-voter turnout and the current equity of Harrisonburg's seven precincts for all city voters.

JMU students living on campus can register to vote in the Spotswood precinct, which is geographically the smallest in the city.

"Basically, you're talking about my very smallest precinct and splitting it in half," Logan said.

Each of the seven precincts saw voter turnout of 1,800 to 2,300 during the 2012 presidential election and between 800 and 1,100 for the 2014 gubernatorial election. Precincts are designed for a maximum of 5,000 voters, and in last year's election, only 173 of 2,240 voters registered on JMU's campus went to the polls, Logan said.

She added that those registered on campus are mostly inactive because they have since moved off campus and not updated their information.

Humphries cited accessibility as the reason to establish an on-campus polling place for students, but Logan said Wednesday that the distance from JMU to Spotswood Elementary School is less than a mile.

By comparison, she said, in the other precincts, voters must travel as far as 1.2 to three miles.

On-campus students at Eastern Mennonite University and residents of Virginia Mennonite Retirement Community, for example, both travel farther to vote in Harrisonburg than JMU students.

"I'm just trying to look at all citizens the same," Logan said. "Take away where they are, take away what they do, all citizens have equal access to getting to the polling places."

She asked that instead of a new precinct, the city make a greater investment in educating students on campus about their voting options, including absentee ballots.

In a March 31 letter to the Electoral Board from Maggie Burkhart Evans, executive assistant to JMU President Jonathan Alger, the administration gives its support for the creation an on-campus precinct for students.

"Understanding that expenses may be incurred in this process, James Madison University is willing to partner with the City to explore a plan for sharing potential costs," the letter says.

Logan told the board that it would cost approximately \$20,000 in startup costs and about \$4,000 annually to establish a new voting precinct.

"Should the measure pass City Council, the administration will gladly meet with members of the Electoral Board and City staff to discuss plans for an on-campus voting location," Burkhart Evans writes.

Humphries, 21, said after the board's meeting Wednesday that he was pleased with the progress on the issue.

"As far as the numbers go, I mean ... they could be better," he said of the student turnout. "But I think we need to be deciding that if we're getting a precinct on campus, I believe that that would inherently turn out more students to vote."


# Map Showing Proposed Voting Precincts


# Map Showing Proposed Voting Precincts
