

# Black Rifle

## COURSE:

- The event starts with Six (6) assaulters and One (1) sniper/observer. Sniper/observer will have NO live ammunition on their person. The precision rifle will be checked and marked prior to the event starting.
- All team members will start at 100-yard line. On the command of GO the six (6) assaulters will go to the 50-yard line and the sniper/observer will go to the 150-yard line. Once the sniper/observer is in the box they can get behind the rifle or scope and determine the target. Once the sniper/observer has determined the target they will radio the target to the assaulters.
- Once all six (6) assaulters are in the box the first two (2) may proceed to the 10-yard line, load their rifle and put two rounds on the designated target. Show clear weapon and head back to 50-yard line box. You may tag the next shooter to proceed to the 10-yard line to shoot the designated targets. Once all assaulters have shot and are back in the 50-yard line box, the assault team must then go and pick up the sniper/ observer.
- Pick up the sniper/observer and their equipment and carry them back to the 100-yard line. Once all team members are in the box, at the 100-yard line time will stop.
- \*You may NOT drag your sniper/observer they must be carried. If they are dropped that will count as a procedural violation. \*

## EQUIPMENT

- Six (6) carbines or submachine guns
- 1 rifle w/ scope or spotting scope provided
- Pistol
- Eye and Ear protection

### Ammo needed:

- 0 precision weapon rounds
- Two magazines of five (5) carbine or submachine gun rounds.
- 1 full pistol magazine.

### All other competitors:

- Full Kit (Tac body armor and helmet)
- Duty Holster
- Eye and ear protection

## PENALTIES

**30sec:** Misses or incorrect target

Assaulter can cut the lines to be considered a hit.

**Procedural violations** will result in a ten second (10) penalty each.

**DQ:** if any shooters leave the shooting box with a loaded weapon, if anyone violates the 180-degree rule, any acts that are grossly unsafe to competitors, judges, or spectators.
