Description:

Project will construct three sidewalk segments to fill gaps between existing sidewalks and improve safe pedestrian access to two different schools: Waterman Elementary School and Keister Elementary School. One sidewalk segment is on Gay Street at Waterman Elementary School where sidewalk will be constructed to fill a gap in the sidewalks along Gay Street and to create a safe and direct sidewalk and crosswalk to the school building. The sidewalk currently ends at the parking lot with no safe route provided to walk through/across the parking lot. The second sidewalk segment is on 1st Street leading directly to a crosswalk to Waterman Elementary School. Students currently walk in the road for this one block from the sidewalk on Lee Street. The third sidewalk segment is on Central Avenue at Keister Elementary School where there is a gap in the sidewalk along Central Avenue. While this sidewalk does not lead students to the school building, it will ensure that students and other people walking along Central Avenue have safe and continuous pedestrian infrastructure. In total, approximately 850 linear feet of 5' wide sidewalk will be constructed.

Purpose And Need:

The purpose of this project is to construct three sidewalk segments and improve pedestrian access at two different elementary schools. The need of this project is to fill gaps between existing sidewalks to create a continuous and safe route for students and other pedestrians.
